Agenda Item 2

Rochdale Township Area Forums Code of Conduct

It is established by and for the Rochdale Township Area Forums that the following code of conduct will govern the behaviour of their members. The code of conduct will be enforced by the Chair of this meeting.

Conduct at meetings

Members will at all times observe accepted practice while taking part in discussions to:

- Be courteous to each other and support and assist other members in finding the best possible solution to problems being discussed
- Allow each other the opportunity to speak and comment
- Attempt as far as possible to stick to the agenda and assist each other to reach effective conclusions
- Operate within the constitution where applicable
- Aggression, violence, threats, harassment, intimidation and other disruptive behaviour in the forum will not be tolerated
- The term 'members' applies to all those present at the meeting

Confidentiality

- Members will refrain from mentioning specific individual cases which may cause embarrassment or identification of an individual
- Any information or item shared that is of a confidential nature will not be disclosed to anyone else apart from members of the Forum in order to allow the business of the meeting to proceed.

Dignity at meetings

- All those who attend Forum meetings have the right to be treated with dignity and respect regardless of their race, colour, ethnic or national origin, nationality, gender, marital status, age, sexuality, religion or any other matter which causes people to be discriminated against
- The meeting will do all that is in its power to oppose all forms of harassment and bullying

Individual Members

- Should disclose any personal interest that they consider may affect or influence their approach to the matter being discussed
- Must show respect in all their dealings by observing reasonable standards and courtesy, and by not seeking to take unfair advantage by virtue of their position

Political Affiliation

- Even though individual members may be affiliated to/or be members of a political party, they may not represent a political party in their role as individual members of this Forum
- Elected Members attending meetings outside the ward they represent may be allowed to speak, at the discretion of the Chair.

Breach of Code of Conduct

- If anyone attending the Forum meeting does not abide by the code of conduct, the Chair will have the discretion to decide on an appropriate course of action. The Chair may either issue a warning, ask the person to withdraw from a particular agenda item or exclude that person from the meeting.
- Where a person is asked to leave a meeting, the Chair will have the discretion to decide whether or not that person is welcome to attend future meetings.
- The Chair at his/her discretion, may close the meeting if he/she deems it necessary

1. WELCOME, INTRODUCTIONS AND APOLOGIES

Introductions were made and all were welcomed to the meeting.

2. CODE OF CONDUCT

The Chair referred to the code of conduct and asked all to abide by the code for the duration of the meeting.

3. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING AND MATTERS ARISING

The minutes of the previous meeting on Thursday 22 June 2017 were agreed and the following updates were given.

Fly tipping

Numerous reports of continuing fly tipping around Holborn Street had again been reported and removed since the last meeting. Currently the area is clean and tidy and thanks were given to Diane Lodwig for both cleaning the area up and engaging with residents.

Road surfaces

The poor state of the road surface on Holborn Street at the junction with Mayfair Gardens was marked out and some of it repaired to a high standard, but the rest left marked out. Highways have been asked to complete the works. The repainting of the road markings at the junction of Holborn Street and Finsbury Street was requested some time ago and it has been chased up by Councillor Sullivan.

Overgrown weeds on Cotton Lane

Cotton Lane has been cleared of overgrown weeds and nettles.

4. POLICE AND COMMUNITIES TOGETHER

Crime figures since the last meeting on 22 June 2017 are improved.

- Four burglary dwellings have taken place (two of which were attempts and one at an empty property where nothing was stolen).

- Two thefts from motor vehicles where items were left on display and three thefts of motor vehicle (two of the vehicles were stolen in a burglary on Lime Street). A prolific vehicle crime offender has been arrested and charged and is currently being monitored on a Tag Curfew awaiting a trial date.
- Two criminal damages (one where a taxi was kicked).
- A number of complaints about youths playing football and being verbally abusive to Brimrod Lane residents are being dealt with in conjunction with Rochdale Boroughwide Housing.

Emergency Services in Greater Manchester have teamed up to help young people aged at least sixteen stay safe on the roads in a Safe Drive Stay Alive Campaign. New drivers with friends are invited to attend an emotionally engaging road safety performance based around a series of short films and presentations on Thursday 9 November 2017 from 7pm to 8.30pm at the Middleton Arena. The Dutch Reach technique of safely opening vehicle doors to avoid hitting cyclists was praised and highlighted.

A discussion on the best method to telephone the Police took place with examples given and circumstances when to use the 101 non-emergency number as opposed to 999 emergencies only number.

5. OPEN FORUM

Community Coordinator

Carlo Schroder, Rochdale Borough Council Community Coordinator from Neighbourhood Services, outlined his Home Office funded role to positively bring communities together and counter extremism and he raised awareness of Hate Crime reporting.

Green belt land

An update was provided on the latest Greater Manchester Combined Authority Spatial Framework from 16 August 2017 in which it gave thanks to members of the public for the 27,000 responses to their initial consultation on the initial draft of the Greater Manchester Spatial Framework. The next stages of the process will start in September 2017 with the publication of some of those responses. This activity will be followed later in the year by the publication of data and associated sources of information that will help inform the next draft such as population estimates. The second draft of the plan will then be developed in the new year with a view to be published in June 2018. This re-write will take into account concerns raised in the consultation by aiming to make the most of Greater Manchester's brownfield sites and reduce the impact on the green belt and there will be a further twelve week consultation with the public.

The Bamford Greenbelt Action Group have identified and submitted to Rochdale Borough Council twenty one brownfield sites in the Borough suitable for development (only one of which is in Bamford at the rear of 91 Norden Road, for which there is already a planning application in from McCarthy and Stone Retirement Lifestyles Limited to demolish 91 Norden Road and develop a thirty apartment building with access and parking). The application is still open for public comment.

Block gullies

Councillor Sullivan expressed the need for residents to report blocked gullies, especially with the autumn leaf fall where gullies and drains can become blocked very quickly. From this month, Rochdale Council crews will be clearing leaves to stop pavements and roads becoming slippery/messy and to prevent road gullies becoming blocked. Although there is a programme of work, reports from local residents are very useful and will help the Council to prioritise the cleaning and lower the number that get missed. Well maintained gullies help to ensure the drainage is working as effectively as possible. Blocked gullies and drains should be reported to the Council online or telephone 0300 303 8879. Gullies reported will be added to a prioritised work list and attended to.
