Rochdale Township Area Forums Code of Conduct

It is established by and for the Rochdale Township Area Forums that the following code of conduct will govern the behaviour of their members. The code of conduct will be enforced by the Chair of this meeting.

Conduct at meetings

Members will at all times observe accepted practice while taking part in discussions to:

- Be courteous to each other and support and assist other members in finding the best possible solution to problems being discussed
- Allow each other the opportunity to speak and comment
- Attempt as far as possible to stick to the agenda and assist each other to reach effective conclusions
- Operate within the constitution where applicable
- Aggression, violence, threats, harassment, intimidation and other disruptive behaviour in the forum will not be tolerated
- The term 'members' applies to all those present at the meeting

Confidentiality

- Members will refrain from mentioning specific individual cases which may cause embarrassment or identification of an individual
- Any information or item shared that is of a confidential nature will not be disclosed to anyone else apart from members of the Forum in order to allow the business of the meeting to proceed.

Dignity at meetings

- All those who attend Forum meetings have the right to be treated with dignity and respect regardless of their race, colour, ethnic or national origin, nationality, gender, marital status, age, sexuality, religion or any other matter which causes people to be discriminated against
- The meeting will do all that is in its power to oppose all forms of harassment and bullying

Individual Members

- Should disclose any personal interest that they consider may affect or influence their approach to the matter being discussed
- Must show respect in all their dealings by observing reasonable standards and courtesy, and by not seeking to take unfair advantage by virtue of their position

Political Affiliation

- Even though individual members may be affiliated to/or be members of a political party, they may not represent a political party in their role as individual members of this Forum
- Elected Members attending meetings outside the ward they represent may be allowed to speak, at the discretion of the Chair.

Breach of Code of Conduct

- If anyone attending the Forum meeting does not abide by the code of conduct, the Chair will have the discretion to decide on an appropriate course of action. The Chair may either issue a warning, ask the person to withdraw from a particular agenda item or exclude that person from the meeting.
- Where a person is asked to leave a meeting, the Chair will have the discretion to decide whether or not that person is welcome to attend future meetings.
- The Chair at his/her discretion, may close the meeting if he/she deems it necessary

1. INTRODUCTIONS AND APOLOGIES/CODE OF CONDUCT

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting. Attention was drawn to the code of conduct, a summary of which was read out. All attendees were asked to abide by the code for the duration of the meeting. The Chair asked that the groups' best wishes for a speedy recovery be passed on to Rachel Hudson.

2. PACT MEETING - GREATER MANCHESTER POLICE

Crime statistics for the ward (past three months and previous three months)

Anti-social behaviour	21	27
Criminal damage	49	33
Burglary dwelling	23	22
Burglary other	7	8
Theft from motor vehicle	11	7
Theft of motor vehicle	13	23

PACT priorities - Current priorities are anti-social behaviour, particularly around Kirkholt and the library, and speeding around Queensway/Oldham Road.

Speeding

PCSO Adams plans to organise a traffic operation with traffic PCSOs as they have additional enforcement powers, and access to the mobile speed van. A discussion took place and it was acknowledged that the problem starts from Castleton via Queensway, however as this is a small team, PCSO Adams intends to prioritise Oldham Road first. It was agreed that cameras are not usually the answer and that education is key. Various suggestions were made, including representation to the Council's Cabinet with regard to current policy, and a suggestion of displaying accident damaged vehicles at public events. There were also reports of increasing numbers of vehicles that are not displaying front number plates.

Action 1: Townships to check progress of speed surveys on Broad Lane and Shaw Road

Action 2: Councillor Meredith to pursue funding for a speed survey on Queensway/Oldham Road, jointly funded by Balderstone & Kirkholt and Castleton Ward Funds.

Action 3: PCSO Adams to arrange a tamper-proof number plate event.

Drug Dealing

Residents reported witnessing drug dealing on Crompton Avenue. All were advised to report all incidents to 101, regardless of how much information they are able to provide, as this builds up a picture of activity in a particular area, which assists the Police in targeting their resources.

Off-Road Bikes

As with the above, residents were encouraged to report all incidents to 101.

3. COUNCILLOR UPDATE

Councillor Meredith

- Confirmation that he is working with Officers to ensure that there will be a Christmas tree at Kirkholt this year. Discussions are taking place to identify the most suitable location.
- There will be a Christmas event at The Hub on 22 November 2018.
- Councillor Meredith gave updates on various road improvement schemes recently completed.
- Any resident with an issue to report was encouraged to contact Councillor Meredith direct.

Councillor Nickson

- Remains very committed to the schools. Current roles include Vice Chair of Governors at St. Cuthbert's and Chair of Governors at Brimrod Primary School.
- There have been problems with the allocation of school places this year. Whilst Councillor Nickson is not aware of any children in the ward failing to secure a place, she is keen that the problems experienced this year are addressed in time for next year.
- Government cuts mean that the Council is £0.5m short for its services for 2018/19. All residents were urged to put forward ideas for future savings direct to Councillor Brett, Leader of the Council.
- The ward has taken part in Rochdale in Bloom for the first time. The commitment from Sandbrook School was excellent and it would be good to get more 'Friends' groups involved next year.

Action 4: Councillor Meredith to make links with the Rochdale in Bloom Steering Group

Councillor Farnell

Not present for update.

4. PRESENTATIONS/UPDATES

Kirkholt Million

Following the demise of Rochdale CVS, finances are now sitting with the Big Life Group. A new plan is under review which will include a timetable of action. A number of schemes are planned, including development of a ranger scheme and improvements to the Rhodes Crescent/Mornington Road areas. Cartwheel Arts are working on a history of the estate which will result in the production of a book. Funding has been agreed to Friends of Balderstone Park for play equipment, and for furniture and equipment for the new hub. The group are able to subsidise other groups within the area for rents, room hires, etc and they are happy to receive applications.

Rochdale Boroughwide Housing.

Not present for update.

Skate Park

The terms of the funding from Big Local state that any works on the skate park need to be funded by the Millions Project, not the Council. It was agreed that the funds allocated by the Council would be decommitted and returned to the Township Funds.

Action 5: Townships to decommit funding to Balderstone Park and inform Environmental Management

Springhill Playing Fields

Representatives of the Springhill Playing Fields Residents Action Group attended to express frustration at the lack of responses from the Council's Legal Team with regard to the current situation concerning the status of the fields. It is understood that Rochdadians are in possession of a licence and that a lease is being pursued.

The group is still challenging the erection of the perimeter fence and is requesting open access to the fields. The group has successfully managed to get the fields registered as an asset of community value, and is now pursuing Village Green status. Despite appeals to the Council's Monitoring Officer, no progress update has been forthcoming and the group is now considering a formal complaint to the Council.

A request to Councillor Meredith for signage in relation to the ACV status has not progressed due to the lack of clarification from Legal.

Action 6: Townships to contact Legal for a formal response.

5. MINUTES OF LAST MEETING AND MATTERS ARISING

The minutes of the previous meeting were agreed.

Action 7: Councillor Meredith to raise with Rochdale Boroughwide Housing

Medical Centre & Hub

Land has been agreed by Cabinet and the building is due to start in October 2018. The keys to the Hub are due to be handed over. The open date is still not confirmed. The remaining block of shops will eventually be demolished.

Public Realm Inspectors

A question was raised in relation to the number of penalty notices issued. Councillor Meredith is now Chair of Communities, Regeneration & Environment Overview & Scrutiny Committee and will bring that information to a future meeting.

6. OPEN FORUM

Tree – Crompton Avenue

A branch recently fell from a tree onto the pavement. Residents stated that the tree has been dangerous and a request for attention has been logged since 2005. It was stated that the branch could have caused somebody serious harm.

Action 8: Councillor Meredith to report direct to Mark Widdup

Skate Park flood lights

For various reasons it had been decided not to progress with flood lights.
