W/08/24	Newton Street pot holes repair	Repair of potholes on Newton Street, Rochdale with jet patching of defects to improve driving conditions, reduce the risk of vehicle damage and mitigate potential trip hazards for pedestrians. Residents have been informed this repair work is a temporary measure as Newton Street is an unmade road that lacks a proper foundation and surface course, making it more susceptible to deterioration. W/10/24	Leonard Street (Co-op) Car Park repairs	Repairs to the surface of the unregulated Leonard Street Car Park, Castleton to enhance its condition for driving, reduce the risk of vehicle damage and improve accessibility for users. The poor condition of the car park has resulted in motorists avoiding the car park and parking on surrounding streets instead, causing obstruction and access issues for local residents and safety hazards for pedestrians forced to walk on the road. Improving the car park's condition will encourage usage of the designated parking location to reduce street parking in residential areas, achieve better traffic flow in surrounding streets and improve safety for pedestrians. A similar women's group in Ashton-under-Lyne have extended an invitation to members of Pakeeza Women's Group to visit as part of a programme of activities delivered by the group to address the issues of loneliness and social isolation. Group members will have an opportunity to experience positive social interaction and establish or build supportive relationships. The visit will enable Pakeeza Women's Group members, who are primarily over 50 and from the South Asian community, to engage with a new social circle and share experiences and learn about different approaches to addressing social isolation and improving the quality of life for older women. An area will be established to enable the children and their families to cultivate vegetables and fruits that they can harvest for healthy snacks and meals, promoting improved eating habits and enhancing their understanding of the origins of their food.
