The project will provide 12 sessions on various art forms (for example music therapy, storytelling, craft skill, reminiscence, textiles, poetry, film, etc) to be chosen by the participants (two sessions per week with freelance professional arts at MAMC). Aims to promote positive relationships, friendship and positive change through the medium of art; share knowledge and experiences across the generations; improve self-esteem through skills learnt and social interaction, and capture experiences through audio and film. Environmental Management support the installation of new litter bins in these areas and they have agreed to meet the future revenue costs of emptying the bins on a regular basis. Provision of a shipping container would offer shelter from the elements and storage for tools rather than transporting them to and from the site. A chemical toilet offers more flexibility concerning the length of time working on the site and provides facilities during weekend events. The tools would ensure equipment is accessible for all interested in participating in activities at the allotment.
