Residents are encouraged to participate with the event promoted through the local press, a local magazine distributor and online in the months preceding each year's summer carnival. <b>Project Description</b>	Feasibility study into traffic calming in the Princess Road area after complaints received about speeding vehicles. Speed surveys in four locations required involving the placement of tubes over a week long period to determine vehicle speeds and volumes of traffic in the Princess Road area, Firgrove. The surveys will help identify if there is a speeding problem and a report will be prepared outlining the results with options to address any issues. (Project brief at Appendix 4B)				
<b>Risk implication</b>	Equipment is vandalised requiring additional visits which may incur extra costs.

<b>Project Description</b>	'Skills4Sport' programme offers free access to quality training and work experience leading to paid work in the Sports and Leisure Sector. Participants enhance their employment prospects with the opportunity to gain knowledge and skills in this specialist sector with access to Community Sports Leaders Level 2 Coaching course, Emergency First Aid course, Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults Certificate, Coaching Disabled Performers Certificate and pathways into additional training such as Swimming Pool Lifeguards and Swim Teachers. Volunteering and work experience will enable participants to secure good competence based skills and showcase their talents and abilities to potential employers. The programme for the duration of 8 weeks (one day or evening a week) has a target participant audience of 20 students starting at 14 years of age and upwards. Skills4Sport identifies those most at risk of remaining in economically inactive situations and support them into a work environment and employment whilst encouraging a healthy lifestyle and volunteering to benefit the local community. <b>Project Description</b>	NatureEd CIC propose to deliver a project that will provide more and better connected habitats for attracting bees and other pollinators. Working in partnership with The Wildlife Trust, a network of 'Buzz Stations' and 'Stops' will be planted with early flowering species within the grounds of two primary schools per ward to create new Buzz habitats that will offer extra stop-off points for bees. Interactive Buzz educational activities will help to inspire the children to actively care for bees and other pollinators all year round, give added value to the various Buzz habitats created by The Wildlife Trust within school grounds and raise awareness in the wider community. NatureEd propose to commence the educational sessions from November 2019 onwards with schools given the opportunity to select the activity that fits with their learning outcomes. <b>Project Description</b>	Pennines in Bloom propose to enhance the Whitelees Road area, Littleborough with the installation of two wooden planters containing a variety of herbs that the local community can pick for their own use to benefit their health, improve the taste of their meals or enjoy the aroma. A wooden framed flower bed at the side of Tattersall's Bakery on Featherstall Road, Littleborough will create an attractive floral display and climbing plants will be planted against the wall on the verge in front of Ashley Dearnley Court on Halifax Road to change a drab stone wall into a striking horticultural feature. <b>Project Description</b>	Restoration of a 4 valve BBb tuba as the instrument is currently unusable and Milnrow Brass Band has been relying on a loaned tuba that is due to be returned. A vibraphone and glockenspiel requires replacement as the existing instruments are not to current contest standard and the motor of the vibraphone no longer works and the glockenspiel has a note missing. Milnrow Brass Band requires the restoration/replacement of these instruments to enable the players to continue performing to a high standard at both contests and concerts. PTC/13/19	Holy Trinity Project 2020	Littleborough Lakeside	Yes People Place	PCC of Holy Trinity Church	£20,000
<b>Project Description</b>	Holy Trinity Parish Church, Littleborough works alongside the community to improve their lives through involvement in social activities. Project 2020 is an initiative to address the limitations of the existing church building concerning providing services (outside of faith based support) and facilities for user groups and the wider community. A new floor is a major element of the structural work required to realise the building's potential as a space for community use. Costs are based on previous work that the Vicar has carried out in another post and discussions with an Architect and the exact cost of the project will not be known until the project is submitted for tender. The church has raised £80,000 and secured a grant of £5,000 from The Beatrice Laing Trust for Project 2020 and plan fund raising events, applying to a variety of grant funding bodies and set up a crowd funding site.(Application form at Appendix 4G)

PTC/14/19	Arm Road/James Street Grass Verge Removal	Wardle & West Littleborough	Yes Place	Councillor Dearnley	£6,500
<b>Project Description</b>	Removal of the grass verge on Arm Road leading onto James Street, Littleborough to create a better kerb alignment around the bend in the road to aid traffic flow and resolve the issue of vehicle overrun damaging the grass verge and the subsequent maintenance liability. Wardle & West Littleborough Ward Councillors have agreed to the allocation of £1,000 Ward Fund towards this proposed scheme and seek the balance of £6,500 from Pennines Township Capital Fund (Project brief at Appendix 4H)				
<b>Risk implication</b>	Estimate assumes the grass verge has no drainage or underground services that require diversion and no requirement to undertake public consultation.
